

Dear Dancers & Parents:



The week of October 23rd, we will be ordering our costumes for our end of the year recital on May 4th, 5th & 6th. It is extremely important that costumes get ordered so that we can get them back to you for altering before our class pictures mid Spring.

Please measure your dancer for costumes at home. Directions are found below- there is also a tutorial on our website home page. If you do not have a soft tape measure and cannot borrow one to take measurements, we do have some available for you to use AT THE STUDIO. Please take the measurements BEFORE your child's class next week. We will be collecting the sizing sheets and checking to make sure the costumes we have picked out will work for each particular class (many costumes come in only children or only adult sizes). **YOU will then order costumes, pick out your child's size, and pay the difference from the costume deposit, the week of Oct 23rd.** Payment can be in the form of cash, check or credit card. (If using a credit card, you must come up to Dawn's desk and hand her the card to run or give her your consent to use the card you have on file). Average costume prices are between \$65-\$80 (minus the costume deposit). We do our best at the Power Of Dance to select tasteful, less expensive costumes we feel our dancers will love to wear.

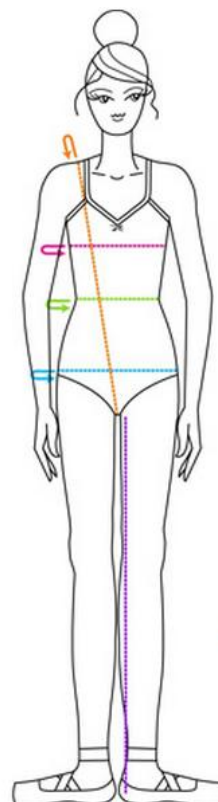

Getting the Measurements:

- Please enter the following:
- A. Bust _____
 - B. Waist _____
 - C. Hips _____
 - D. Girth _____
 - E. Inseam _____
- **Bust/Chest** – Measure over the fullest part of the chest having the dancer's arms relaxed at their sides.
 - **Waist** – Measure around where the waist naturally indents. Keep your finger between the tape and their belly.
 - **Hips** – Measure around the fullest part of the hips and buttocks while your dancer stands with their heels together.
 - **Girth** – Measure from the midpoint on the shoulder towards the front, through the crotch and back around to meet the midpoint of the shoulder. **Watch this How to Measure Girth video** for a demonstration.
 - **Inseam** – Measure from the crotch to the bottom. The inseam length is the number of inches, to the nearest half-inch.



- sizing charts may vary from class to class. Please check each one carefully. If student lies between sizes, we recommend you order up. If in doubt, girth is generally the most important measurement for one piece costumes.
