

# Area dance studio gaining popularity

The Power Of Dance, LLC has a simple philosophy when it comes to its competition teams. There is one goal—put your best performance on the floor. “When you take the emphasis off of winning and you put personal improvement, effort, and love of a team in its place—that’s when success happens,” says Power Of Dance All-Star coach Theresa Kubalak. “Even though our coaches have years of experience, we are a relatively new studio. With that said, the Power Of Dance All-Star teams are on their way to a great competition season. On December 5th, the POD All-Stars competed in their first competition, the Green Bay Holiday Dance Classic at the Brown County Arena. Five teams from the Power Of Dance competed including a Senior Team, 2 Junior Teams, a Youth Team and a Mini Team.

A total of 60 dancers participate on the Power Of Dance All Stars. The teams had an outstanding day placing 3rd in Senior Hip Hop, 1st in Junior Jazz, 3rd in Junior Pom, 1st in Youth Hip Hop, and 2nd in Mini Hip Hop. The

Power Of Dance also did well in the individual and small group events with Lily Mae Wiesler taking home 1st in the Elementary Solo Division, Lauren Sedlacek taking 2nd in Middle School Solos, and the pair of Paige Bunkleman/Michaela Miller placing 5th in High School Duets.

The POD All Stars will be competing at the UPA Americup Competition in Minneapolis, Minnesota the weekend of February 19th-21st and will be competing locally at the Triple S Dance Competition at the Weidner Center on April 23rd-25th.

The Power Of Dance is located at 2300 Lineville Road, just ½ mile west off highway 41.

In just its 3rd year, the studio has over 265 students attending regularly with an additional 30 taking seasonal classes. Why is it growing so quickly? It could be the high energy styles of dance the studio is known for, the incredible individual attention the staff gives its students, or perhaps the owners’ reputations for improving their dancers in a short period of time. Whatever the reason—the Green Bay area is definitely feeling the “Power Of Dance.” Students range in age from 3-75 and registration is now open for the session beginning February 22nd.
