We are in the midst of students being quarantined again; The Power of Dance has purchased Zoom accounts for each of our studios. We utilize our Zoom accounts to allow **dancers to participate from home**. POD is paying for these accounts as an exclusive courtesy for our families, not the general public. Our class accounts are meant for the dancers and we have noticed some classes have had non-dancers logged in watching.

The more people that log on to each class, the smaller the screen is for those at home (and our teachers!) trying to actually participate. **Therefore, we ask that if your student is present IN the room for class, parents refrain from logging on.** We have viewing windows on each door as well as a large viewing window for our preschool classes. In addition, we have Parent Observation Days throughout the year. If you would like to watch from outside, please let your teacher know and he/she can open a curtain if not too distracting.

It's early in the season and we would like to remind all families of our policies while utilizing ZOOM to take class at home.

1. Only dancers that are missing class should be logged in.
2. The dancer/dancer's family will need to have his/her camera on. This is to ensure that the teacher can view the dancer at all times and help instruct them while at home.
3. If there are people not identifying themselves, not turning their cameras on, and/or logging into classes with generic titles (i.e., iPhone user), we will be ending the meeting. For the safety of the students and protecting their privacy and identity, we do not allow outside parties to view classes.
4. The space, floor, dress of the dancer, and the environment should be safe for dancing and free from distractions.
